The new range of S-Class cars (W126) was launched in 1979 with the first UK cars arriving in autumn 1980. The new wedge shape with less weight helped with fuel economy whilst retaining the comfort. The wheelbase was increased and the body to boot size relationship changed. Automatic was standard on all V8 engined cars. Within a year the (Energy Concept) engines were introduced, and in 1985 all the engines were revised with a single-cam, 3-litre and a 4.2 V8. A 5-litre was re-introduced in late 1987. This is a book of contemporary road and comparison tests, specification and technical data, new model introductions, driver's reports, buying second hand, long term tests, touring. Models covered include:- 280, 300, 380, 420, 500, 560, SD, SE, SEL, SEC, AMG and Koenig.

“ In compiling this brief history of Grand Prix racing, along with descriptions of the more successful cars, I have limited myself to the period since World War II as the present day Grand Prix cars are mostly derived from the development and design of the early post war years. Although many ideas were taking shape in the period of the mid-thirties — such as the use of De Dion rear axle layouts, independent front suspension systems and hydraulic brakes — the main interest lay in engine design under a free ruling on capacity. It was not until about 1950 that a renaissance began in chassis design for Grand Prix cars and from then on a great deal of knowledge was gained; enough in fact, to enable roadholding to become a very exact science rather than a hit-and-miss affair. This development in the chassis and the search for improved road holding and higher cornering power was accentuated by the beginning of the era of unsupercharged racing, when power outputs were severely curtailed and speed had to be found by other means ” (1959 - Denis Jenkinson)

Consumer Psychology

Carrera Panamericana: the Mexican Road Race. In its day it was the longest, fastest and likely wildest international automobile race ever staged. A World Championship event along with Le Mans, the Mille Miglia, Nüburgring and the Tourist Trophy, most drivers considered it the best-and the worst-of them all. From 1950 to 1954, it was witnessed by ten million spectators along a nearly 2,000-mile course that featured deserts where the faster cars could reach 180 mph and 10,000-foot mountain passes requiring first-gear operation. Carrera Panamericana influenced engineering and marketing from Michigan to Modena. Ferrari designed and named a model specifically for the race. Lincoln emerged as a high-performance sedan and Porsche's Carrera was named in honor of its wins. The Pan-Am was so unconventional and fascinating that it came to hold the world's attention for a full week each year. It was one of the last of the great open road events and the first in which European and American cars could be compared and marked the return of US factory support to racing in America.
